What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. How often does Mission notify me about its practices?	Mission notifies you about its sharing practices when you open an account. Mission's privacy policy is also included with ongoing client statements.
How does Mission protect my personal information?	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures, including computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p>Mission educates our employees annually about the importance of confidentiality and client privacy. We take appropriate disciplinary measures to enforce employee responsibilities regarding personal information. Mission limits the ability to process transactions which require knowledge of personal information to only those employees whose job functions specifically include such activity.</p>
How does Mission collect my personal information?	<p>Mission collects your personal information, for example, from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Information we receive from you on forms; • Information about your transactions with us; • Bank/brokerage account statements you provide to us; • Estate planning documents you provide to us; • Tax reporting you provide to us; and • Other financial information you provide to us.
Why can't I limit all sharing?	Mission does not share clients' personal information with non-affiliated third parties for marketing purposes. We do not sell client information.

Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies. NDFCU Holdings, LLC
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nonaffiliates with whom we share personal information can include trust accounting software providers; Arizona Department of Insurance and Financial Institutions, system security providers; or our financial audit firm.
Joint Marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission does not jointly market to clients.
